


ANNUAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING

Introduction to New White Oak Supported Missionaries

White Oak in our budget for 2026 will be supporting some new missionaries. Here is a brief introduction to each of them so you can begin to pray for them.

Donny & Courtney Harwood

Donny and Courtney met while studying in Atlanta in December 2012 and married in Scotland in November 2013. Since then, the Harwood family has expanded with the addition of their two beautiful children.

Donny is a native of Glasgow, Scotland, and serves as a bi-vocational assistant pastor at Christ Presbyterian Church (PCA) in Newnan, Georgia. Alongside his role at the church, Donny uses his background in physics to serve in a data and analytics role for a large corporation in Atlanta.

Courtney is a native of Milledgeville, Georgia, and is a writer. She spends much of her time at home with the kids, but you will also find her working on her latest fiction novel in the local coffee shop.

The Harwoods are following God's call to return to Donny's native land and his hometown of Glasgow, Scotland, to strengthen an existing Free Church congregation in the heart of the student-dense West End and to plant churches as part of the Free Church of Scotland's vision to plant 30 churches by 2030.

While Donny is doing the work of preaching, discipleship, and evangelism, Courtney will be ministering to the women and youth of Glasgow.

Tat & Patty Stewart

Tat and Patty Stewart, World Witness "missionaries-at-large" to Farsi-speaking people from 1994 to 2013, continue in the same ministry as Volunteers. Tat is pastor to the Iranian community and the Iranian Christian Church of Colorado. He is on faculty and the board of directors for PARS Theological Center and is on the board for Christians International. In addition, he serves the Farsi-speaking world as a ministry coach, personal counselor, through conferences, and teaching at Horizon's International, training missionaries for the Islamic world. Tat's Farsi-language sermons are taped and distributed around the world to Iranians who have no church. Tat is the founder and executive director of TALIM MINISTRIES which produces a quarterly magazine called "Shaban" (which means pastor) and develops and distributes Biblical resources for Farsi speaking leaders world wide.
