Sin is a pervasive part of our lives, and we must confess our sin to God and then receive the forgiveness that Christ gave the Church the authority to declare.

He once preached 41 sermons on John 17, then apologized to his congregation that he had, "only scratched the surface." Come join us as we continue our study of John 17, often called, "Jesus' High Priestly Prayer," and see what we can learn from this passage of Scripture.

The Sermon is where we explore scripture together and corporately encounter Christ.

Session approved a motion to recommend to the congregation that the following men be elected Elder Emeritus: John Hemphill, Sonny Oliver, & Roger Schroeder. A congregational meeting will be called for this purpose.

Session approved a motion from the Worship Committee that the Worship Committee will be the point of contact for any changes to the sanctuary, to include seasonal decorations, furnishings, paint/stain, or fixtures of a permanent or temporary nature. This responsibility excludes the weekly centerpiece floral arrangement. The Worship Committee will deliberate on the proposed change (s); then, if necessary, escalate any such proposals to the Diaconate or Session for action. (Remember alterations to the church buildings or property will be performed only with prior Diaconate approval.)

Session discussed present practices regarding communion frequency and evening services. Further discussion will be scheduled for the next meeting.
