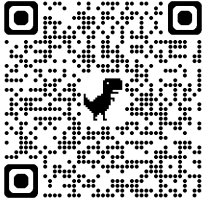

Updates from Lithuania:

- Dainius Jaudegis was ordained as minister in September 2025. He will be serving in the Kaunas congregation and the Kedainiai congregation.
- The Kedainiai congregation has up to this point only held services once a month, and the frequency will be increased with the combination of Dainius and Frank helping with services. Kedainai was a center of the Reformation in Lithuania and the building has existing since 1652, but currently only 6-8 people attend services. The building is now a museum not owned by the congregation, but they are able to worship there. They are hoping the church grows as there is more active ministry there.
- Frank van Dalen will focus on the English-speaking evening service at Kaunas, now called International Reformed Church of Kaunas.

Prayer requests from Dainius:

- For changes according to God's Word, in the Lithuanian Evangelical Reformed Church. The growth of the Kaunas congregation, as well as God's wisdom and provision in repairing and restoring the church building.
- The rebuilding of the Kedainai congregation--that we may find close relationships with existing members and that the Lord may give us new members.
- Pray for Rita (Jaudegis) as she transitions into a support role for me. She has been a wonderful help but also continues her other part time jobs. Ministry expectations are always an adjustment.
- God's provision for our family, as I started full-time ministry. We have experienced God's faithfulness in so many specific ways in the past years, and we trust in His goodness.

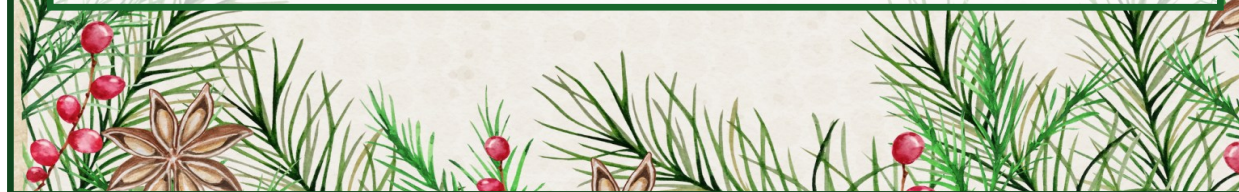
