Living In Rwanda - Sam & Martha Cotton - SEED Ministry

Martha-Margaret, Gloria-Noelle, and I lived and served in Rwanda for four months this year. Seeing the resilience of our Christian brothers and sisters was extremely encouraging. Living among the people deepened our understanding and strengthened the partnership that makes our ministry possible.

Last fall, the Rwanda government shut down over 9,000 churches, which affected every church represented by students in our 3 cohorts—roughly 90 students who suddenly found themselves without congregations to serve. In response, World Witness and Reach the Children International (RCRI) co-launched the Jerusalem Project, to come alongside RCRI-recommended churches, helping them complete the requirements necessary for reopening.

The results so far:

- Two churches successfully reopened. The Nyabihu church is one in which eight congregations meet every Lord's Day in a series of consecutive services.
- Two additional churches are currently in process, one of which is pastored by a SEED graduate.

Discipleship and theological education are thriving in Rwanda. Students are demonstrating perseverance and commitment to Christ, even as they navigate the challenges of pastoring without buildings. World Witness is seeking at least two missionary families for church-planting ministry. Our research during these months confirms this urgent need. Rwanda faces a leadership vacuum that presents both challenges and unprecedented Gospel opportunity. Are you called to join us?

Please pray for continued progress for the two churches working toward reopening, and pray the Lord would raise up missionary families to join the field.



We welcome into active church membership today Devin and Noel James. We thank God for bringing their family to White Oak and we look forward to serving Christ together.



Sermon Notes- Sunday October 5th

There comes a time when a person has to make a stand; but for what and why? In Luke 9 Christ traveled to Jerusalem, some stand for Him but some against Him.

They did so for very different motives.

I. CHRIST IN SAMARIA- JAMES AND JOHN.

- A) Jerusalem was not the only place where people stood against Christ.
- B) Who were the Samaritans?
- C) The Samaritans stand against Christ anticipated His rejection in Jerusalem, and even down to today.
- D) James and John took a stand against those standing against Christ. How and why did they do this? Their motive was legalism

II. THREE OTHERS WHO CLAIMED TO STAND WITH JESUS.

- A) V 57. The person who would follow Christ, "wherever."
 - 1) An unqualified commitment.
 - 2) A call to extensive self denial.
- B) V59. A second person prioritized his past & delayed following.
