

A WORD ABOUT COMMUNION AT WHITE OAK

A Word about Communion at White Oak ARP - For Christians, the Sacrament of Communion (also called The Lord's Supper or The Eucharist, which means 'thanksgiving') is a time to meet with their Savior by faith, to be strengthened and renewed by Him as they eat bread and drink wine (juice in many cultures) that represent His broken body and shed blood for our sin. All baptized Christians who trust in Christ alone as their Savior and Lord, belong to a church that embraces the gospel, are at peace with their fellow neighbor, and seek strength and grace to live more faithfully to Christ, are invited to participate. If you are not a Christian, or if you are not prepared to share in this meal, we encourage you to spend this time in prayer and to consider more deeply your relationship to Jesus Christ. We also ask that children who have not yet publicly professed their faith in Christ refrain from partaking until doing so.

ThirdMil Ministries:

The church is growing fastest where there is the least opportunity for theological education. With millions of pastors needed by 2050, the opportunities are tremendous. The Thirdmill Global Network (TGN) is addressing this need with learning communities throughout the world. While it took approximately 20 years to reach one million leaders, through a network of global partners, Thirdmill is on pace to reach the second million within a five-year span. From our beginning until Summer 2020, 1.02 million ministry leaders had been equipped through Thirdmill. At the end of 2023, more than 1.95 million ministry leaders were reported to have been equipped by Thirdmill.


