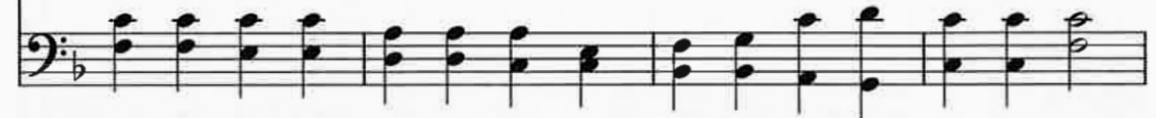

We meet for worship today on the Lord's Day designated on the church calendar as, "Christ the King Sunday," or, "The Reign of Christ Sunday." Christ the King is the last Sunday of the season of Pentecost, and of the entire church year. This Sunday completes the Christian journey through the life of Jesus Christ on earth and in heaven, which began with the preparation for the birth of Jesus in Advent. Next Sunday, the first Sunday of Advent, a "New Year" for the church begins afresh as Advent again begins the cycle of remembering and preparing for the birth of the Messiah in Bethlehem.

On Christ the King Sunday, Christians recognize and worship Christ as king of heaven and earth for all time, without challenge and without end. Yet, since we are still celebrating this day here in the body rather than in the presence of God, we also remember that there is still kingdom work to be done, and that God is not yet finished subduing nations and people to the Lord Jesus Christ. Therefore, we recommit ourselves to prayer, giving, growing and service in and through the church until that Day when the Kingship of Christ is complete.

MISSIONS

Wales Field Report - **Drew & Lauren Goodman**

Dear Friends,

We are encouraged at Christ Church Presbyterian. The Lord has led us forward in reestablishing Christ Church Pres. as a church staged for advancement. We are experiencing God's help as we fellowship. Attendance has increased. We ask the Lord for enablement and blessing in evangelism. Having completed the Hope Hall project, we have started towards replacing the main chapel with new construction using the historic front façade. We are praying and planning for the future of Christ Church Pres. as well praying for our family.

Praying and Preparing for Ministry in East Africa as we continue to pursue our work in Wales, we are also preparing for a ministry transition to Uganda in 2023. Drew has been invited to teach at African Bible University in Kampala. Our family will live on the 30-acre campus with students and faculty. ABU is known as an institution the Lord has greatly used to strengthen the Church through reliable evangelical, reformed teaching.

This ministry at ABU will be incorporated into the World Witness team known as the Barnabas Ministry Field. This work, led by Rev. Lee Shelnutt and Rev. Sam Cotton, was established in Rwanda but is expected to expand to other East African countries. Barnabas Ministry provides accessible, training and mentorship to church leaders. Our residency at ABU will extend this ministry in Uganda and help us support the Barnabas Ministry team in nearby countries.

- When will this transition take place? We will return to the US in June for Synod and World Focus. We hope to arrive in Uganda for the fall semester. We remain flexible to adjust our timeline especially as we work cooperatively with the EPCEW.
- Will our relationship with World Witness change? Our relationship to World Witness is the same. We continue to invite your prayers and support through World Witness.
- What will life be like for our family? Uganda has warm weather all year. The ABU campus is a community of faith, learning, and service. Our children will enjoy enriching life experiences with people from diverse backgrounds. The campus has a football pitch, farmland, animals, radio station, library, classrooms, and chapel used by a Presbyterian church.
- What plans are being made for Christ Church Presbyterian? Our session is working with EPCEW church leaders to make plans before our move. We pray for at least 2 ordained leaders, ministers or ruling elders, to be supplied over the next several years. At least one of those leaders is needed very soon.
- Will we miss Wales and our Church? Yes! Our heart for Wales, its people, and its need for the gospel has deepened. Our church and the EPCEW have shown great Christian love to us, and we hope we have been able to reciprocate the love of Christ.
- How can we pray together? We are thankful for your heart for the gospel in Wales and the UK! Please continue to support our church in prayer. Please pray for the kingdom of God to advance in Wales and in East Africa.
