


# Missions

<u>Cotton (U.K./England</u>) – The Lord continues to sustain and grow the congregation at Gloucester Evangelical Presbyterian Church. We wait with expectant hope to see what He will do in the coming years, as we continue trying to build something that will outlast us and be established as a foothold for the Gospel in Gloucester.

We are facing big challenges and changes this year. We are applying for the status of "Indefinite Leave to Remain" in the UK (the next vital step for our visa) which allows us to live and work here. If approved, we will be granted settled status and will no longer have to apply for a new visa every three years. It is a complex, expensive and crucial process that will save us the ongoing expense and uncertainty of recurring visa applications. After one year of settled status, we should be eligible to apply for British citizenship, which will secure our permanent right to remain in the UK. Please pray for us as we work through this process.

A second big change in 2023 will be our return to the U.S. for Home Ministry Assignment. We value your prayers, as we face a mountain of logistics for travel, housing, and ensuring the smooth continuation of the work in Gloucester, during our absence. Pray for Gloucester EPC and for Rev. Tim Dalton, as he labors in our absence.

#### From White Oak Church Member Oran Hurst:

Several months ago, I happened on the Mission to the World (MTW) website and found an unpaid internship program in Japan. I had no idea this would be the path that God is leading me down, but over the past months, I believe God has called me to serve the people of Japan. I will be serve a year with the team in Nagoya, Japan under the leadership of Brett Rayl. I'll be working with Christ Bible Institute, an organization that equips Christians in Japan to spread the Gospel throughout the region. I am excited to serve with this team to help in an under reached area. Despite being a well-developed country, Japan has one of the smallest percentages of Believers per their population.

The cost to serve in Japan is around \$25,000. This amount covers travel, ministry and living expenses for the 11 months of the internship. I need to develop a team of partners for this ministry. If you would like to be a part of MTW ministry to Nagoya, please let me know. All tax -deductible donations should be made payable to Mission to the World and include my MTW ministry account #: 400732 in the memo line of the check. 
