CHURCH OFFICER NOMINATIONS


- The Nominating Committee for Church Officers has been formed and is receiving nomination from the Congregation for the offices of Ruling Elder and Deacon.

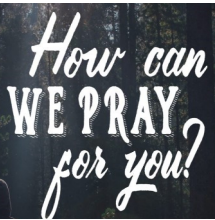

College Student Encouragement/Care Packages

The New Testament is filled with letters that the Apostle Paul wrote to the various churches. Many of those letters are written to encourage early Christians in their faith. Following Paul’s example, the Women’s Ministry Mercy Ministry Team would like to ask your help with showing love and encouragement to our youth. A number of young people are starting college this fall. Many of them will be going away from home for the first time.

1 Peter 5:12b -- My purpose in writing is to encourage you and assure you that what you are experiencing is truly part of God’s grace for you. Stand firm in this grace.

How can I help? Choose a college student to pray for, to keep in touch with by sending up-lifting cards/notes, or to send small care packages to let them know their White Oak family is thinking of them. An information packet containing the student’s address and telephone number is available on the table in the lobby.

Suggested items for the care packages might include:

Personal supplies such as tissues, Band-Aids, hand sanitizer, disinfecting wipes, lip balm, warm socks

School supplies such as note paper, pens, pencils, small stapler, highlighters, sticky notes, Sharpies

Treats like microwave popcorn, packaged cookies, tea or hot chocolate mix with a mug or insulated tumbler

Other: Gift cards for fuel, coffee shops, quick service restaurants, etc.

You might also include news from White Oak (a bulletin or newsletter).

Who can help? Individuals (you could also partner with one or two others age a student), Families, Sunday School Classes. (Sunday School might want to encourage more than one student!)

What do I do next?

You can contact **Billie Gentry** (email: billiegentry@bellsouth.net or 606-9936) to select a college student from the list, and to get their mailing address.

If you are sending a care package, you may want to get in touch with the student’s parents to find out what kinds of things they like, or if they have any food allergies.

Thank you for your willingness to encourage our college students in their faith, and to remind them that their church family loves them.







WOARP HISTORY



God’s character includes His faithfulness, and in this 175th year as an organized congregation, these events happened between 1900 and 1919 in the United States.

•1901–1910 President William McKinley assassinated, Vice President Theodore Roosevelt elected the 26th president; Louis Armstrong born; U.S. Steel founded by J. P. Morgan, first Rose Bowl game played; Harley-Davidson Motor Company created; Ford Motor Company formed; first World Series; U.S. Department of Commerce and Labor created; the Wright Brothers made their 1st powered flight at Kitty Hawk, NC; Panama Canal Zone acquired; Albert Einstein published his theory of relativity; T. Roosevelt received Nobel Peace Prize; San Francisco earthquake; Oklahoma became a state; Ford Model T on the market; Federal Bureau of Investigation established; 1908 Presidential election-William H. Taft elected; William Jennings Bryan lost for the third and final time; the U.S. penny is changed to the Abraham Lincoln design; Robert Peary reached the North Pole; NAACP founded by W.E.B. DuBois; first Indianapolis 500; RMS Titanic sunk; New Mexico and Arizona became states; Girl Scouts of the USA was started by Juliette Gordon Low; T. Roosevelt was shot but not killed while campaigning for the presidency; 1912 Presidential election - Woodrow Wilson elected; Woman Suffrage Procession (a large women’s suffrage parade in Washington, DC), was held on the eve of Wilson’s inauguration; 16th Amendment - established an income tax; 17th Amendment - established the direct election of U.S. Senators; Henry Ford developed the modern assembly line; Mother’s Day established as a national holiday; Federal Trade Commission created; World War I began when Austria-Hungary declared war on Serbia; The Birth of a Nation opened; RMS Lusitania sunk; first transcontinental telephone was hooked up; the U.S. acquired the Virgin Islands; Jeannette Rankin elected as first woman in U.S. Congress; 1916 Presidential election - Wilson reelected; the Great Migration begins; U.S. enters WWI; National Hockey League formed; Temperance movement leads to prohibition in 29 states; First Red Scare, marked by a widespread fear of Bolshevism; Armistice agreement ends WWI; Spanish flu pandemic begins; Daylight Savings Time first adopted; Treaty of Versailles; U.S. Senate rejected Treaty of Versailles and League of Nations; 18th Amendment establishing Prohibition

Other events happening around the world, 1900-1919:

- Edward VII became King of the United Kingdom and the British Dominions and Emperor of India upon the death of Queen Victoria. Cuba was given independence from the United States. Air conditioning was invented. The first teddy bear is created. The first Tour de France is held. Independence of Panama. The Ottoman Empire and the German Empire agree to build the Constantinople-Baghdad Railway. Panama Canal begins being built. Trans-Siberian Railway is completed. First universal suffrage elections in Europe. Japan-Korea Treaty of 1907. Bakelite, the world's first fully synthetic plastic, invented in New York by Leo Baeckeland, who coins the term "plastics.
